2. Uniform for P.E., Escape and Sports-related Elements

- P.E. shirt (House colour)
- P.E. shorts
- Blue P.E sweatshirt
- Tracksuit

3. Drama Uniform

School regulation...

- Black drama shorts and T-shirt
- V-neck maroon sweatshirt or blue cardigan

Completely black shoes

All of the above, apart from shoes, socks and tights, are available through the PTA Uniform shop.

Please Note:

- *Students may only come into school in Drama kit or P.E Kit if they have that lesson first period. Otherwise, they should change into that kit during the break before the lesson.*
- *They must change into regular school uniform after that lesson is over.*
- *They may only leave school in Drama or P.E. kit if they have that lesson last period of the day.*

4. What isn't Uniform?

Basically anything else, including...

- The variety of hoodies (Kukri) with the IS logo. These may only be worn for interschool 'away' events, inter-house athletics, swimming etc. (off site). After consultation last year, the PTA has stipulated that they are not part of the regular uniform (P.E. included); hence the fact that they cannot be purchased through the uniform shop.
- Other sweatshirts, hoodies, tracksuits, etc.
- Leggings
- Non-regulation scarves
- Beanies, caps and other assorted headwear

If, for medical or religious reasons, a parent wishes to request an exception be made for a child with regard to uniform, the parent should contact tutor or Head of House.

If, on any occasion, a student is not able to wear full school uniform (as outlined above), the student should have a signed note of explanation from his/her parent preferably in the school diary.
